
Welcome to Penn State Wilkes-Barre!

If you are an Adult First Year Student

Students with less than 18 credits are First Year Freshmen. All first year students are required to take placement tests. This helps you and your adviser decide which courses will suit you best.

Testing...One...Two...Three

One...You will receive a **postcard** with information about placement testing and your deadline for completing testing online.

Two...You take tests in English, math and—if applicable—chemistry. But don't worry and don't cram. Test results have no bearing on your Penn State admission.

Three...When you come in later for advising and registration, a counselor will review the test results with you.

OR...

If you are an Adult Transfer Student

Students with 18 or more credits do not take the First Year Placement Test. Transfer students should contact the Advising Office at (570) 675-9217 or wpt2@psu.edu to schedule a meeting with an academic adviser. Your adviser will assist you with course scheduling and also provide you with other important information for completing the enrollment process. In your offer packet you will receive an Evaluation of Transfer Credit letter; bring this document with you to the advising session.

Academic Advising, Class Scheduling and Orientation

The **advising session** is designed to provide you with the tools necessary to promote your academic success. During this session you will complete the following: schedule your courses, activate your computer Access Account, and have your picture taken for your Penn State id+ card, register for your free parking permit, and purchase your textbooks at the bookstore. Your adviser will review the following, where applicable, to determine the best courses to take in your first semester at Penn State: your test results, high school record and college transcripts.

Scheduling Classes

While you're here for advising, you can also **schedule** your classes in relative calm, well before the last-minute rush. When you leave campus, you'll know what classes you'll be taking, and you'll know where everything is—parking, eating, classes, sports, activities, and places to hang out, chill out, use the computers, get help, or study in peace.

What about Books?

The on-campus **Penn State Bookstore** recommends that you purchase your textbooks a week prior to the start of the semester.

How do you know which books to buy? It's easy. By that time you'll already have your schedule of classes. Just take that schedule to the bookstore, and they'll know which books are required. For more information call 570-675-9230.

When Do I Pay for Tuition?

Did you have to bring that up? Yes, it's inevitable. Penn State no longer sends paper bills. Bills are e-mailed to your **Access Account** (your Penn State e-mail address), which you set up when you schedule classes.

Bottom line...

A minimum one-third payment on your balance will be due three weeks after the billing date.
