Always make sure you know where you stand with your grade by communicating with your faculty member. There may be ramifications regarding financial aid. If you have questions about your aid status, please touch base with Stacey Zelinka, our Financial Aid Coordinator. The last day to withdraw from all of your classes if you feel you are going to receive mostly failing grades is Friday, May 2nd. Before making this decision, be sure to speak with your academic advisor about the implications of doing so.

Final Exams week runs from May 5th to May 9th, with Friday being a make-up day. Commencement on our campus will be on Saturday, May 10th, 2014.



sufficient research about the company/job prior to the interview.

There are several excellent websites to aid in your research: hoovers.com, vault.com, wetfeet.com and glassdoor.com. If you'd like help navigating these sites, please let me know. Penn State University has established accounts with some of these valuable websites which allows students full access for free!

Another vital component of successfully preparing for an interview for a job or internship is to participate in a mock interview. This structured practice interview will help build your confidence for the real thing as you gain experience with answering typical interview questions. Students may also use Penn State Wilkes-Barre's technology, Interview Stream. This program allows students to record a mock interview any time that is convenient for you and receive feedback on your interview from a career counselor. ### **Reminders on Using Possessives**

When plural nouns end in the letter "s," forming the possessive is easy: an apostrophe is simply added at the end of the word.

Ex: Teachers are happy for all of their students' successes. The flowers' colors mingle well together.

However, many plurals are irregular and do not end in the letter "s," (such as women, men, deer, mice, phenomena). For irregular plurals, the possessive form is indicated the same way it is for singular nouns.

Ex: Men's and women's sweatshirts are all on sale. The phenomena's impacts were widespread.
