

Who or Whom?

The decision about which to use is as easy as knowing the difference between subjects and verbs. WHO is ALWAYS the subject of a verb, as are the words: he, I, she, they, and we. All are SUBJEC-TIVE. WHOM is OBJECTIVE. Confusing the pair is no different than confusing these pairs: her/she, I/ me, and them/they. Try substituting he/she for WHO, and her/him for WHOM to be correct every time!

For Example:

Who made the appointment? (He/She made the appointment; you wouldn't say her/him made the appointment.)

He gave the message to whom? (He is the subject, and gave the message to her or him; so whom is correct, and has NO verb.)

Do you know the student who left this book? (You is the subject of know, and he or she left this book; you wouldn't say her/him left this book.)

She knows for whom the bell tolls.

(She is the subject of the verb knows, and the bell tolls for her/him; so whom is correct, and has No verb.) &
